About the Speaker

Leonie Clarke is a pharmacy graduate of Trinity College Dublin and a longstanding member of PIER. She has been Project Manager with the Irish Medicines Verification Organisation (IMVO) since October 2015. She has run her own consultancy since 2006, advising clients in the pharmaceutical and healthcare sector on medicines legislation, industry codes of practice and corporate governance. Her extensive experience in the pharmaceutical industry includes several years as Scientific & Regulatory Affairs Manager with the international research-based industry trade association in Ireland. A former President and board member of the Irish pharmacy regulator, she also worked for that regulator early in her career. She is a former chairperson of the European Pharmacy Students Association and is co-author/editor of 'Pharmacy and Medicines Law in Ireland'.

Overview of Webinar

Leonie will draw on her experience with the Irish Medicines Verification Organisation to describe the role of national medicines verification organisations (NMVOs) in the rollout of the new FMD safety feature requirements, the NMVOs' key relationships, progress to date, what has/is working well, and the many challenges still to be overcome ahead of the implementation deadline of 9th February 2019.
